CAICC Booster Club

Purpose:

The purpose of the Booster Club is to support the *Career Academy for International Culture and Commerce at Clearwater High School.* The Academy does not receive funding from the school district. General membership shall be open to all students, parents, families, teachers, and community members interested in its support and promotion.

Areas of support include the following: raising funds for field trips, equipment, program supplies, classroom supplies, yearend banquet, clerical support; monitoring students and assisting in the school store, securing guest speakers, chaperoning field trips, assisting with special events, securing business partnerships, providing publicity regarding Academy activities, and participating in fundraisers and school projects.

Membership for new families is just **\$45 a year**, and this *includes the student's CAICC polo shirt*, which is required for all CAICC field trips and other functions. CAICC Booster membership for returning families is just \$25 a year. Once you join the Boosters, you have the opportunity to open a **Student Account**; *in order to maintain your existing student account and participate in Booster fundraising options, you must join Boosters each year*.

- Meetings are held at 7:00 pm in the CHS media center on the first Tuesday of each month and ending in April unless otherwise announced.
- The Tornado Exchange (school store) is operated by the Academy staff, students, and parent volunteers.



The Career Academy is self-supporting and has many expenses in order to keep the office running with mailings, assisting with field trip costs, meal reimbursement, chaperone fees, staff training seminars, and many, many more. Your Booster membership is just one way you are helping with the cost of running our great program. If you want to do more to help, we have created an account for donations to help defray some of these costs. Direct Donations may be made by parents, students, other family members, and especially employers. Donations can be specified for certain events. For example: to cover the cost of field trip buses or to sponsor a student that may not have the funds to participate. Since the Academy is a non-profit organization, all donations are tax deductible.

As each year passes, our membership continues to grow. We began over 25 years ago with 18 students. Today, we have almost 400 students in our program. An integral aspect of CAICC is to supplement classroom instruction with various educational and cultural field trips. Each year, all four grade levels take at least two instructive, curriculum-based field trips.

CAICC Field Trips

A vital part of the CAICC program is the educational field trips that students attend each semester. These field trips offer students unique opportunities to see the curriculum from their various classes applied in the outside world. Through these field trips, CAICC students are also exposed to various and farreaching careers available in international business.

These field trips are both a privilege and a responsibility and therefore **mandatory** for all CAICC students. *If a student is unable to attend for any reason, s/he must submit a note to Leslie Hopkins, Director of CAICC, and may have to complete an extra assignment.*

Because the students are representatives of both CAICC and Clearwater High School, certain dress code requirements apply. In addition, the purpose of the Academy dress code is to uphold the professional image associated with the Academy and to prepare Academy students for the business world. The dress code helps students gain awareness of the image one's attire projects in the business world.

Appropriate attire is required for all students while on Academy field trips or for any other Academy function that may be required as part of the program.*

Slacks: khaki or black

No visible body piercing other than ears!

Inappropriate attire includes:

- Denim or chambray fabric clothing (jeans) of any kind
- Overalls, shorts, skorts, stretch or stirrup pants, exercise or bike shorts
- Backless, see-through, tight-fitting, spaghetti straps, or low-cut blouses, tops, dresses
- Flip flops, sandals, bare feet, over the knee boots
- Hats, scarves

*IMPORTANT: For each CAICC field trip, the Academy teacher that is leading the trip has final say for dress code guidelines specific to that trip.

Student Insurance Required!

Mandatory: Each year, all CAICC students MUST purchase student insurance coverage in order to attend the *required* Academy field trips. **NO** student will be allowed on the required field trips without student insurance. School insurance must be purchased online:

- 1. Enroll online http://www.pcsb.org/site/default.aspx?PageID=15271
- 2. Click on "*Enroll Now.*" (on right-side of page)
- 3. Type in required information, pay by credit card or E-Check, print out your receipt and ID Card.

Once the insurance has been purchased, please *print a receipt and bring the receipt to Mary Roble in the Academy Office.* You may also email your Insurance Confirmation to Mary Roble, <u>roblem@pcsb.org</u>. If you have obtained school insurance for sports participation, Drama, Band, or other clubs, please print out or email an additional receipt and send this in for the Academy records.



Parents who join the CAICC Booster Club will have the option of opening a **Student Account.** Students and parents who participate in CAICC Booster fundraisers will have the profits from their sales efforts credited directly toward their own balances. *Families MUST join the Booster Club each year in order to participate in Booster sponsored fundraisers and maintain and add to their student's existing account.*

The students may use these accounts to pay for Academy field trips; however, they are encouraged to allow their balances to accumulate in order to fund their senior Academy class trip, which is traditionally to New York City. Funds for the senior class trip will be transferred directly to Clearwater High School.

Per District policy, students must use these funds exclusively for CAICC field trips; therefore, **no student may have more than \$1,500 in his/her account at any time**. If a student earns over this amount, the money will be placed in the general fund to be used for student scholarships and other academy expenses. If a student leaves CAICC or upon graduation from Clearwater High School, any monies remaining in his/her fundraising account may be allocated to a sibling who is in the program. **Otherwise, the balance will be credited to the booster club general funds**.

If, at some point, a student realizes that he or she will be unable to go to New York, then that student can no longer contribute to his/her student account. If a senior CAICC student has determined that s/he is not going on the Senior New York trip, then s/he may still participate in CAICC Booster fundraisers (as long as the family has joined the Boosters for that school year) and with the understanding that any money raised will no longer be added to that student's individual account; rather, any money raised at that point will be added to the CAICC General Fund and/or into a special senior account for the New York trip.

Moreover, once the senior trip has been fully paid for, a CAICC student may no longer contribute to his/her student account. If you have any questions or concerns about these policies, please contact the CAICC treasurer and/or the CAICC Executive Board.

Policies and Procedures

Membership in the Career Academy is a privilege. Students are held to high academic and behavior standards. The CAICC program's expectations are designed to encourage academic and extracurricular success for its students. Students may enter the Career Academy only at the start of their ninth grade or tenth grade years, thereby allowing for the continuity and completion of the CAICC curriculum.

ACADEMIC EXPECTATIONS/CONSEQUENCES:

• Students must maintain a minimum of a 2.0 unweighted GPA for each semester; students who fall below a 2.0 will be placed on *Academic Probation* for the following semester. Parents will be notified in writing of the probation, and the students will be allowed one semester to improve their grades to a 2.0 or higher. If the student is unable to improve his/her GPA at that point, then possible dismissal from the program will be decided by committee.

• Students must pass all Academy classes.

BEHAVIORAL EXPECTATIONS/CONSEQUENCES:

- Students must not have excessive absences without acceptable documentation.
- Students must adhere to the **Student Code of Conduct** policy. Repeated discipline infractions may result in student being placed on probation.
- Appropriate and respectful behavior is expected especially on CAICC field trips and other times representing the Career Academy.

• If a student commits a serious disciplinary infraction, s/he will be placed on *Immediate Probation Due to Serous Discipline Infraction*; these students may be removed from the Academy with no consideration of readmission. In addition, students who are on I *Immediate Probation Due to Serous Discipline Infraction*; will not be allowed to attend CAICC field trips. A *letter of appeal* may be filed for these situations, and the committee will review student's discipline, academic, and attendance history when determining their decision.

• Students whose grades and/or discipline are in question may lose privilege of attending Academy field trips (and alternate assignments may occur).

Regarding Probation:

• After two semesters on probation, removal from the program will be decided by committee.

• A student on *Immediate Probation Due to Serous Discipline Infraction* who does not perform according to the requirements to remain in our program will be immediately removed from the program.

DRESS CODE:

The purpose of the Academy dress code is to uphold the professional image associated with the Academy and to prepare Academy students for the business world. Appropriate attire is required for all students while on Academy field trips or for any other Academy function that may be required as part of the program.

REASSIGNMENT TO A DISTRICT DISCIPLINE PROGRAM OR EXPULSION:

Reassignment to a district program or expulsion will result in immediate removal from the Career Academy. *No readmission under these circumstances will be considered.*



Passport to Italy

This year the Academy will host its 25th annual Passport to Italy Spaghetti Dinner and Silent Auction. This is one of the most exciting events of our school year, and one of our greatest fundraisers for our senior CAICC students' trip to New York City. The cost of the dinner is approximately \$12 per person.

Area restaurants donate the sauce, breads, salads, and dessert.

<u>The Junior Class CAICC students are expected to be servers for</u> <u>the evening.</u> These students' families must be members of the CAICC Booster Club, and those who work will receive their share of the evening's proceeds. They are required to wear their Academy shirts and khaki or black slacks.

In addition, each CAICC student in every grade level is required to donate at least one item for the Silent Auction. Each student is also expected to sell tickets for the dinner. Ten Dollars of each ticket sold by the student goes directly into the student's account.

This is a great opportunity for our Junior CAICC students to raise money for the Senior trip to New York City. It is also an excellent opportunity for students, parents, and staff to interact and have a great evening out. Many parents are needed to make this special evening successful. Please be ready to do your part!
